Speaking of Educationals, we wish to hold more classes, develop more instructors and innovate new educationals and improve old classes. In order to accomplish this, we need to be on the lookout for new places to hold our educationals.

Bella's Traveling Library Exhibit received a call on June 21, 2012, from the Fine Arts Department of J Erik Jonsson Central Library, the main Dallas Public Library located in downtown Dallas, Texas. The manager had remembered reading an article about Bella's Traveling Library in the Southwest Now magazine. She called the magazine and got our names and phone number. The Dallas library invited us to bring our exhibit to them. The exhibit is to be on display for six months. We set the exhibit up in early July and it will remain there until January, 2013. We had to hustle in order to get enough items to place on display. The exhibit consists of two 30ft x 8ft x 6ft walk in display cases, two oft x oft display wall cabinets and five 2ft x 2ft x 1ft stand alone cabinets. In one of the 30ft display areas is an "Old Watch Maker's Shop" with clocks appropriate to the era represented. In the other large display area is a "Railroad Watch and Clock Exhibit". When looking at the "Old Watch Maker's Shop" and the "Railroad Exhibit" you feel like you are stepping into that time period. They are spectacular. One of the wall cabinets has a display of "Atkins Wood Gear Clocks" and the other one consists of "French Clocks".





The **"Atkins Clocks"** are really neat and the **"French Clocks"** are absolutely beautiful. A special presentation of **Cyclometer/Numechrons Clocks** by the Dallas Library Arts Department is included in this display. We were also asked to do a **Children's** display on the 2nd floor and it will be there for six months. We will do a **Children's Program** for them in the fall. This exhibit is a chapter project involving chapter members and is in a location which gives Chapter 124 and the NAWCC exposure to Dallas' business and civic leaders and the general public.

Fred Tischler has been asked by the Dallas **J Erik Jonsson** Central Library to give his lecture, "**The History of Clocks**," on Saturday, October 27th, in the Fine Arts Department Auditorium and introduce the different horological items in our exhibit to the audience. There will be a reception held for Chapter 124 preceding Fred's talk.

I would like to thank everyone who gave their time to put this exhibit together, brought clocks, watches, pocket watches and horological items, railroad items and etc. All of you came together to pull this exhibit together in such a short time. **Lone Star Chapter 124**, you are amazing. **THANK YOU!!!**
