Person Of Interest

You never know what is going to happen on an interview with a person. In the past, I have been blown away by Richard Cox and his vast collection of all of the cars I like a lot. When you go to Pam & Fred Tischler's home, you will be impressed by the museum quality of their collection. Mark Vozar's collection of Seth Thomas clocks all work! I won't say what you will find when you come to my house.

I used my GPS to find Phil Gregory's home in a surprising community in Los Colinas. I walked into an incredibly tall, vaulted living room that has an incredible collection of large clocks. I had come to talk about wood geared clocks and specifically Atkins Clocks. I found a unique collection of Steeple-on-Box clocks which were very popular because of their shape.

Phil has held many positions in NAWCC and Chapter 124. He has prepared for the NAWCC a very interesting book, *Pillar & Scroll,* the history of Eli Terry and his industrial revolution in the clock making industry with his assembly line mass production of clocks and cabinets. The book includes over 100 photographs of these beautiful clocks and the factories were they were built.

The Clocks of Irenus Atkins written by Phil Gregory & Robert King explores the Atkins family in 19th Century Connecticut. It illustrates an accurate history & description of their company as well as the influences of other companies producing clocks at that time. Both books are available thru Phil or NAWCC.

Phil teaches several classes and gives lectures for NAWCC, several chapters and Chapter 124.

Phil showed me several fine examples of clocks with reverse glass paintings. These seamed very delicate in spite of their size. There was also a large collection of French clocks collected by Phil's wife. They were many cast metal clocks with stone bases and figurines. I was impressed that they were both interested in clocks but in different directions.

As I walked around the house and his office library, I noticed that there were models of tanks, fighter planes, helicopters and missiles.

When we sat down, I asked him what he did for a living. The next two hours were fascinating. Phil has had an exciting career designing missiles and target acquisition systems like those on the apache helicopter.

He developed a better control system for Neil Armstrong's X15 to fly correctly at high altitudes. He has developed air defense missiles, not only for the US, but France, Switzerland and several other countries.

One of the challenges of designing a defensive missile is to get it to hit the missile fired off by the enemy. Laser guided missiles worked for many targets but when trying to hit a reentry warhead like the Scud a guided missile called Patriot 3 was defined by Phil as his last system for the US. The system was developed for the Army by "The Strategic Defense Initiative" or

"Star Wars" started under President Regan. He developed a system called ADATS for the Swiss which you can find on the internet.

He has traveled all over the world as a consultant on new projects. What an interesting person! It is interesting to think that the efforts of this man has saved thousands of lives and made us all better and safer due to his work.
