At 10AM, folks moved into the museum's theater to thank its owner and staff for the opportunity to tour the facility prior to its public opening, and to recognize longtime member Byron White for his donation of a Sessions Regulator to Chapter 124 for the Frisco, TX Railroad Museum. An introductory film of the museum collection and guided tours of the museum followed. The meeting was a tremendous success and our collective thanks go to Homer DeFord, Homer DeFord III, and Rick Wilkins for their hospitality, generosity, and collegiality. This was a unique Chapter meeting! The Oct. 10th One-Day met in Grapevine at the Founder's Building. Attendees were greeted by hot coffee and fresh donuts starting at 8AM. Rather than an educational presentation, the focus of the educational was to update members on significant upcoming Chapter events, including planning for the 2017 National NAWCC meeting in Arlington, the Frisco Railroad Museum, as well as what's in store for 2016. Chapter 124's Introductory to Pocket Watch Repair Course



Elgin Watch Factory is now loft apartments.

On September 26 and 27th Bill Andrle and Clint Kleen put together and presented a very basic Pocket Watch Repair Course. This course was intended for collectors that think they would like to repair or at least learn about pocket watch basics. The course instructors Bill Andrle and myself, Clint Kleen are not by any means watch makers. We both profess to be novices which I believe makes this course even more beneficial to the first time collector. We can still remember the magnitude of the idea that we were going to take a working watch apart and put it back together. To some it is like jumping out of a perfectly good airplane.



We chose a working 16 size Elgin Grades 290 or 291 or 292 which are basically the same movements. A lot of interchangeable parts. (Check <u>www.elginwatchparts.com</u> and look at each part list).

We had 5 students show up to take the Class – I started it off with a power point presentation about how a watch works, the nomenclature and I discussed a little about how to find parts on the internet and my website www.elginwatchparts.com.

Bill took over and went through the tools and how they are used. He showed how to check your tweezers and fix them so that you have a better chance of not shooting screws across the room. He moved on to the screw drivers.

By the end of the first day each student had the watch apart and cleaned!

The next day the students began the easy job of putting the watch back together.
