

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE October 2016 Edition

Chapter 124 continues an active Fall schedule with education, meetings, drafting the 2017 schedule and planning for our National Convention in Arlington. The Board is working on improving the auction process. The Chapter serves as the sales agent for members and the general public who want to dispose of watch and clock collections. This enterprise has been very labor intensive in the past and the Board is considering ways to make it more efficient and fair to all involved. The collection and auction process runs through dedicated volunteers who devote countless hours collecting horological items and bringing them to point of sale. There is a reluctance on my part to attempt naming all who have contributed; surely I will leave some important people off the list. But the Chapter thanks Bruce Wooldridge, John Evans, William Slough, Hugh Slough, E. K. Wilson, Joe Richards, Mike Granderson and many more. They have given tirelessly of their time and effort to make this process run smoothly.

The August 6th One Day had strong attendance. Several vendors sold horological items and we had an active Silent Auction. Bruce Wooldridge gave a demonstration on bluing metal through heat treatment. He showed how to prepare the surface before heating and what color to look for in order to bring the metal to a deep blue color. This is very useful when bluing clock screws and other parts. The heat bluing he demonstrated gives a much more translucent blue hue than the more opaque, steel-gray of chemical bluing. Thanks Bruce for the informative education presentation. The next One Day is October 8th at our alternative location on the second floor of the clock tower building cattycorner from the Founders Building in Grapevine. Mark Vozar will present on making an automated filer from a Martin pattern.

Since the last Newsletter several Chapter 124 members attended the 2016 National Convention in Louisville, Kentucky. Louisville is a beautiful city to visit with rolling hills, many large trees and the Ohio River on the northwest side. It is a city devoted to tourism with several major sports facilities, Churchill Downs, the University of Louisville, good restaurants and interesting places to tour. The Louisville Convention showed that even a small chapter can offer an outstanding convention and reflected the leadership of people like Frank Webster, President of Kentucky Bluegrass Chapter 35. Several of our members were in attendance and helped run parts of the convention and sell 2017 Arlington National tables. In 2017 we will follow with our own outstanding convention. John Acker and his committee have done an outstanding job organizing the Convention and selling tables. His report follows in this Newsletter.



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE CONTINUED

Several Chapter 124 members also attended the San Jacinto, Chapter 139 Houston Regional. They had an active mart and interesting education program. I attended two informative education presentations on "Using UV Glue for glass and Plastic" by Gordan Shahin and "Copying Wood Moldings" by Bob Holkan. Gordan demonstrated gluing two glass panels on edge using UV glue, such as could be done to make a glass clock cover. One source of UV glue supplies is www.dkhardware.com, look for CRL UV701 and 702. Bob demonstrated how to make a hand scraper for shaping one-off design moldings to match those missing from old wooden clock cases. He used metal saws and files to form scrapers which can form wood into the appropriate molding profile. John Acker and his committee also sold 2017 National registrations and tables.

Education:

Wood Clock Case Restoration (CD-100) offered September 3-4 filled to capacity with 12 students attesting to the interest in doing historically accurate case restoration. There were several projects for students to work on including French Polishing Texas walnut panels, dying and staining Texas pecan panels and doing practice restoration on Chapter provided old clock cases. Each project taught an important technique needed to do appropriate restoration. Students brought their own clocks the second day and the class did an analysis of what should be done to restore the cases. The clocks brought by students represented a wide range from those only needing cleaning to some that required complete restoration. The 12 attendees had many thoughtful questions that resulted in productive discussion of restoration techniques. Because of the enthusiastic group of students, as the instructor I think I had more fun than anyone. Hopefully we will be able to offer the class again next year.

As copy for this Newsletter is being written, Mark Vozar is teaching Kitchen Clock Repair (CR-100). This is the basic class that serves as the gateway for many of the other Chapter classes. Because of its importance we try to offer CR-100 twice a year, once at the first of the year and once at the end of the education schedule. Thanks Mark for your expertise and hard work offering these important fundamental classes.

American Pocket Watch Repair (FSW, F-301) will be offered October 21-24 by Ferdinand Geitner. He is a recognized expert in watch repair and offers a comprehensive watch repair class. The last class for 2016 will be Weight Driven Clock Repair (CR-400) by Phil Ball. If you haven't registered for this important class in our clock repair sequence please do so now. The Open Bench Workshop (OW-100) scheduled for November 6th has been canceled because of building use conflicts. We plan to start the 2017 education sequence in January and are negotiating with the Grapevine Tourist and Convention Center staff to arrange the schedule. 2017 National Convention

Lone Star Chapter 124 will host the 73rd National Convention of the NAWCC next June, and we need all of your help to make it a success. The convention will be held at the Arlington Convention Center the week of June 25th, with official activities beginning on Wednesday, June 28th. Watch and clock collectors from all over the world will descend on north Texas for a week of lectures, exhibits, contests, and wheeling and dealing – and we need to show them a healthy dose of Texas Hospitality!

The week will begin with specialty classes offered through the FSW Program and AWCI, and formal meetings of our National Board of Directors. The organizing committee is working on local tours for Wednesday to showcase some of our local attractions. Wednesday evening will kick off with a reception sponsored by the Chapter Relations Committee, followed by the Keynote Address on **The Clocks of Joseph Ives** by noted author and Ives expert Philip Morris.
