#### Greetings Everyone.

Whew! Our 2018 Lone Star Chapter 124 Regional is over and we can all relax for the time being. I really do not know where to begin because the attendance and tables turned out much better than I had anticipated. We actually had 526 members attend with 303 tables sold with 21 states being represented. Five people renewed their dues with Lone Star Chapter 124, 14 members joined the NAWCC or Renewed while we had 6 Introductory Memberships.

We kicked off our 2018 Lone Star Regional with Mike Dempsey teaching a class on his own personal "Top 25 Tips on Clock Repair" Thursday, March 1<sup>st</sup>. This class was a showcasing of some of the best repair tips, ideas and shortcuts that Mike has put together over 30 years of clock repair. It included how to make specialty parts, making fixtures and tooling for your lathe and bushing machines, plus how to make a simple gear cutter and repair simple parts. The class had a power point discussion, and then a demonstration on how these things are made. Included were drawings and other technical information on how to reproduce everything. Fourteen members attended his class and fortunately, he will be returning in October to teach our volunteers who missed out.

Unloading began Thursday afternoon with a lot of volunteers, including a group from San Jacinto Chapter 139. The Exhibit on Electric Clocks began set-up Thursday as well. At 6:00 pm the Chapter hosted a Social Hour for all with a Cash Bar, Mexican Food Appetizers and a Silent Auction.

Unloading began on Friday, March 2<sup>nd</sup>, at 7:00 am while Registration opened at 7:30 am. It was a busy morning with Mark Vozar giving a demo on "Replacing Lantern Trundles with Shop Built Tools" at 9:00 am. Ray Marsolek from Arroyo Grande, CA gave a lecture on "Packaging Crystal Regulators and Vienna Regulators" at 10:00 am in the Riata Room while the International 400 Day Clock Chapter 168 met with John Hubby at 11:30 am. The afternoon began with Mike Dempsey speaking on the "History of Electric Clocks" while an Electrical Horology Tour of the Exhibit followed.





There were more than 96 clocks, plus other early electric items in the Exhibit. Dee Koch was the Exhibit Chair with John Acker and Bill Edwards as Co-Chairs. They did an amazing job considering they only had a little over a month to pull this all together!

Later in the afternoon, Bruce Wooldridge gave a demo on "Bluing," which was well received. Then the Chapter 179 Travel Chapter met while Chapter President Mary Ellen Bell gave a power point presentation on future tours.

From 5:00 – 6:00 pm on Friday, Ballroom A was open for members to preview the 125 auction items before the Banquet began at 6:00 pm. Lots of gift bags were given out to each table, as well as Martha Tips' book on "Identifying French Clocks" and \$200 in Mart Dollars as Door Prizes. Approximately 70 people attended the Banquet before the Auction began at 7:30 pm with Jim Sargent as the Professional Auctioneer.

The David Tips Volunteer of the Year Award was given to John Erickson for 2017. John has been on the Chapter Board for seven years, which included a year as President. He had a tremendous job at the 2017 National Convention as the Treasurer and Pre-Registration Chair. The 2018 award went to Evelyn and Hugh Slough as two of our most devoted volunteers. If you get one, you get the other! Evelyn has been on the Lone Star Board for six years while Hugh is always around to volunteer for whatever needs to be done.

# **Fred Tischler Memorial Scholarship Fund**

In November of 2016, Chapter 124 lost one of its most talented and ardent supporters – Fred Tischler. Fred was a teacher, a volunteer, a board member – always willing to share his time and knowledge to advance Chapter 124 and the NAWCC.

An initial memorial gift from James, Phyllis and Justin Barren became the seed for establishing a Scholarship Fund in Fred's memory. The Board of Directors voted to officially create the "Fred Tischler Memorial Scholarship Fund," and appointed John Acker to chair a committee to come up with guidelines on how the fund would operate. Also, serving on the committee are Mike Dempsey, Mark Vozar and Bruce Wooldridge.

The committee is still working out some of the details for operation of the fund, but some items have been decided. The purpose of the fund will be to provide educational scholarships to Chapter 124 members. The educational activity must focus on some aspect of horology. Consideration will be given to the potential for the recipient to give back in some way (volunteer, teach, etc.) to the Chapter. An application form is being developed.

Since that first gift, donations from more than ten other Chapter members have allowed the fund to grow to a total of \$5,058.50. To be fully-functioning, the committee has set a goal of \$10,000 to be available for granting. And, of course, the fund will need to be replenished each year as scholarships are disbursed.

We are excited to announce that an anonymous donor has offered to match NEW contributions up to a total of \$1,000.00!
