Education Report by Barry Kilfoy

Chapter 124 planned 27 events for 2018 including the Regional Convention in March. This included 23 educational class events covering 47 days of training and 4 business related events.

Planned events through July included --

Two Chapter business meetings, Kitchen Clock Repair, 6 Open Bench sessions, a special 2-day Sherline class featuring Jerry Kieffer, Chime Clock Repair, our Regional Convention, Introduction training for both Jewelers Lathe and Sherline Micro Lathe, French Clock Repair, Self Winding Clock Repair, Spring Barrel Clock Repair, FSW – Fundamental Skills for Lathe and Clock Repair, and finishing with a class for Adjusting Common Clock Escapements.



Remaining events for 2018 include 2 more chapter business sessions, and class instruction for Kitchen Clock Repair, 2 Open Bench sessions, a class for Beginning Pocket Watch Repair and a special "2-day/2-event" repeat of "25 tips for Clock Repair" to feature Mike Dempsey. The Self Winding Clock Class

The Self Winding Clock

John Acker gave a very interesting class at the Founders' Building on the Self Winding Clock. A student of the clock both in history and function, explained the process of the clock and the company behind the clock and it's important place in American History.

Several members brought the traditional metal clocks and some beautiful wood clocks for the workshop. John was on hand to assist in the process of repairing clocks in various stages of restoration.

Founded in Brooklyn in 1886 operated until 1970 at 205 Willoughby Avenue in Brooklyn, New York. This site was across from the <u>Pratt Institute</u>, (my alma mater. I had classes in the building used for the Company). Charles Pratt (1830–1891), the founder of Pratt Institute, was also one of SWCC's original founders and the company started business in his buildings. The Self Winding Clock Company clock mechanisms were truly revolutionary ecause the spring that powers the clock was not wound by hand but with an electric motor.

The product this new industry was selling was "exact time". This became possible following the development of the telegraph. The railroads recognized that safety was related to precise timing and all timepieces in a given area must be set to the same time. The heads of the major railroads met on October 11, 1883, in Chicago to adopt our Standard Time System.

The relationship between the two separate companies began with an agreement between Self Winding Clock Company and <u>Western Union</u> (WU) being entered into in June 1889. This agreement was for the transmission of time signals over Western Union telegraph lines to synchronize clocks made by Self Winding Clock Company. SWCC owned the clocks and WU installed and maintained them for a monthly fee, ranging from \$1.25 to \$2.00 per clock per month. SWCC was paid a percentage of the rental fee for providing clocks for the WU customers. If the clock movements required major repairs, they were sent to a SWCC repair facility and a replacement movement was installed by - Western Union at the customer location. Sales people were assigned territories across the US and would service and replace the batteries once a year.

The availability of electricity all across the country eliminated the need for the Self Winding Clocks.
