RICHARD COX presented a two hour slide show on "Building Skeleton Clocks," and PHIL **GREGORY** presented a two hour slide show on "The History of Reverse Glass Painting" to the Minnesota Clockmakers Guild which is affiliated with the American Watch Institute. It was the 9th annual symposium of the group and was held on Saturday October 19. Attendance was about 55, and the all important lunch was served. Also on the program was Laurie Penman of AWI with two presentations on bushings and escapements.

Phil ran a two day workshop on reverse glass transfer painting for 12 students before the symposium. Typical paintings familiar to chapter members were made, and a combination stencil and transfer (that looks like a decal for steeple clocks) was introduced.
